

## ***Our Current Worship Arts Banner***

Many have noticed and commented on the banner at the front of the church. Written in Greek, it says “In the beginning was the Word”, or John 1:1a. This is one biblical text I studied when I took “New Testament Greek” when I was younger.

Greek letters are different than Roman ones, but we can transliterate the sounds to a Roman alphabet as follows: Ἐν ἀρχῇ ἦν ὁ λόγος in Greek might have sounded something like “En archē ēn ho Lógos”

For me, there is something wonderful about the mystery of text I cannot read. While traveling or interacting with people from other cultures, there is something wonderful about the complexity of cultures and peoples that speak languages I cannot; people, patterns of thought, and layers of culture that at once are nearby and feel distant and mysterious. For me, that is the start of a small romance with the unknown — I want to know and understand more. Then, as I study the language and culture, and talk to the people, the veil falls, and I get closer to understanding. But for me, that mystery and distance is an important start. As I get to know the people, culture, and language, then I feel like I begin to close a gap.

For the Bible, in always reading the pre-translated version of biblical text, we skip this mystery phase of our relationship with the Word, a mystery which is none-the-less there. By failing to see the gap between us and the culture and meaning of the words, we fail to make an effort to bridge the gap in space, time, and culture that divides us.

A few years back, when asked to create a banner for the church, I created a small mystery: a banner that has but a segment of text. This is a small mystery that calls out to us from John’s pen, a mystery of divine revelation separated from us through space, time, and language. *In the beginning was the word.* – Steve Mather
